

TOEIC

Le Test of English for International Communication a été créé en 1979 par ETS (Educational Testing Service). Ce test évalue et certifie l'aptitude des personnes non anglophones à communiquer en anglais dans un contexte professionnel et d'échanges internationaux.

le TOEIC est :

* un test objectif et équitable

* un test connu internationalement, avec plus de 4 000 000 candidats chaque année

Le test se compose de 200 questions à choix multiple. Il comprend une section de compréhension orale et une section de compréhension écrite. Les 2 sections contiennent 7 parties au total, toutes précédées d'indications spécifiques en anglais.

Une session du TOEIC dure environ deux heures et demie (formalités administratives comprises).

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The TOEIC test measures your ability to use English in daily business situations covering such topics as corporate development, finance and budgeting, corporate property, IT, manufacturing, purchasing, offices, personnel, technical matters, health and business travel. A growing number of international companies recognize the TOEIC as an objective indicator of a person's proficiency in business English. It is important to understand that the TOEIC does not measure what you have learned in one particular English class but evaluates your general command of the English language in a business setting. This means, you have to use and explore as many materials, resources and methods as possible in order to improve your English. You should create an environment in which you are exposed to the English language on a daily basis. For example, you can listen to the Voice of America, watch television on CNN, SkyNews or BBC, read newspaper articles in English and write emails. In addition, the Internet provides you with a wide variety of learning tools such as electronic newsletters, discussion groups and forums. On english-test.net you will find a large number of interactive tests that help you learn the core vocabulary of the TOEIC test. There is a total of 684 tests with 10 questions each. If you take all of our tests you will have learned 3420 words that frequently occur in the TOEIC.

Test Content

The TOEIC test is a paper-and-pencil, multiple-choice assessment. There are two separately timed sections of 100 questions each.

Section I: Listening

Examinees listen to a variety of questions and short conversations recorded in English, then answer

questions based on what they heard.

- Part 1: Photographs (20 items)
- Part 2: Question - Response (30 items)
- Part 3: Short Conversations (30 items)
- Part 4: Short Talks (20 items)

Section II: Reading

Examinees read a variety of materials and respond at their own pace to questions based on the content.

- Part 5: Incomplete Sentences (40 items)
- Part 6: Error Recognition (20 items)
- Part 7: Reading Comprehension (40 items)

Test Length

The test lasts approximately 2 ½ hours. Examinees have:

- 45 minutes for Section I
- 75 minutes for Section II, and
- the remaining time to respond to biographical questions and a brief questionnaire about education and work history.
